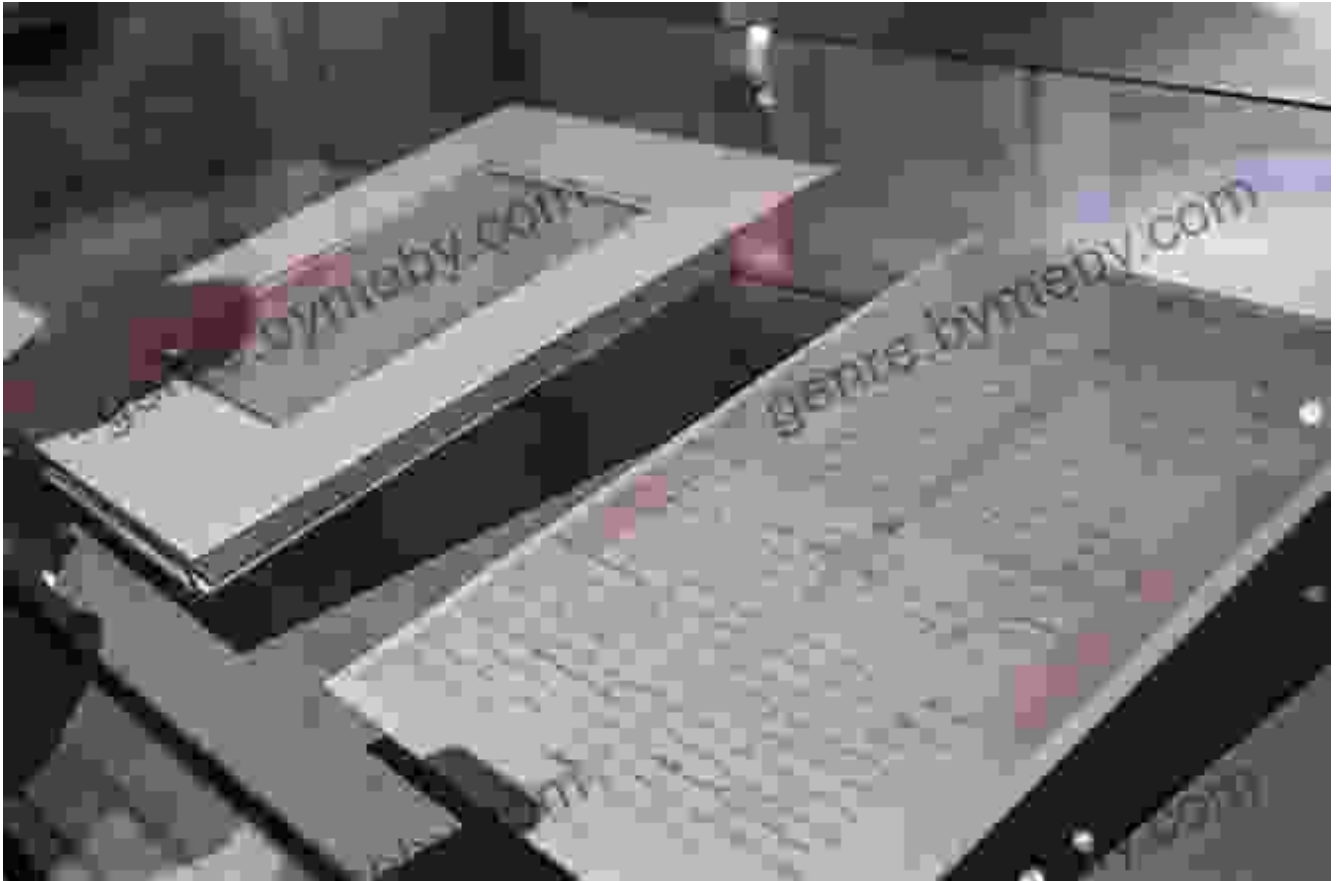

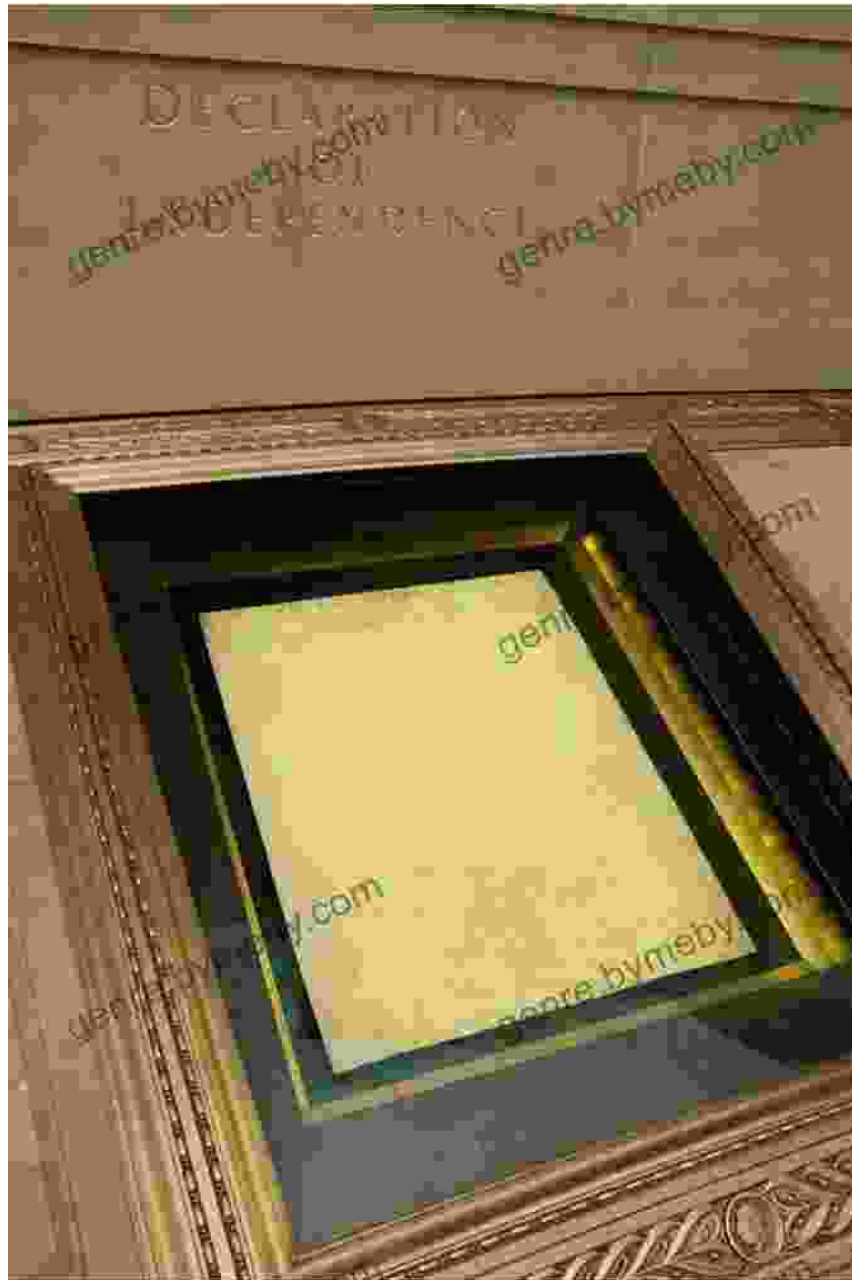
The Nomadic Journey
